
Key headlines

- 45 major bus stations
- Busiest bus stations include:
 - Vauxhall 16 million passengers per annum
 - Stratford 17 million passengers per annum
 - Hammersmith 22 million passengers per annum
- 5% of all bus journeys in London begin or end in a bus station
- 600,000 passengers per weekday use bus stations
- On street interchange numerous locations e.g. Brixton, Elephant and Castle
- Victoria Coach Station is used by 14 million passenger per annum



Customer Satisfaction Scores


 Increased investment reflected in upward trend in customer satisfaction scores

Good interchange - Safety


- Bus station staffing determined by a variety of factors including:
 - Customer numbers
 - Operational requirements (number of terminating routes)
 - Specific localised factors
- All bus stations covered by CCTV
- PA at all major bus stations
- Close co-operation with local Police
- Retail activity






Good interchange -Shelter

Good interchange - Real Time Information


- Recently installed at Vauxhall (photo), Harrow, North Greenwich, Walthamstow.
- Further installations planned at Turnpike Lane and Canning Town.
- Technical challenges at some sites – for example where there are numerous terminating routes.

The Hopper ticket

- The bus hopper fare is set to launch on Sunday 4 September 2016
 - Allows one free bus journey made using contactless or Oyster pay as you go within 60 minutes of an initial bus journey
- Around 75 million bus PAYG journeys per year give rise to a second boarding within an hour.
 - 25m of these journeys are undertaken by customers who currently do not hit a cap and so will save £1.50 per boarding. An estimated additional 5m passengers would also make a saving, based on current travel patterns.
- No change in infrastructure provision is planned following the introduction of Hopper ticket. Whilst the Hopper will lead to an increase in interchange, there will only be a marginal increase in the daily 6.5m passenger boardings, and hence little change to passenger's space requirements at stops
